# DECEMBER GRACEGRAM

This is a recap of the Temple Talk given Reformation Sunday. This was the 3<sup>rd</sup> of four talks given by church leadership regarding the need for Grace's giving to more closely align with our budgeted expenses.

In October, our Stewardship chair, Tim Schoessel, talked about the "big game on the schedule" and the need to prepare for that challenge. It's not simply a matter of having your "game face" on, but more about strategizing, and being flexible, to achieve the goal. We can't predict if some players will get sidelined, whether for the season or just for part of the game. Yet, the team needs to remain *cohesive* and *focused*, each player giving his or her all. Tim then likened the "big game" to our budget: we know what the budget is, that it's the "big game on the schedule," and, at the annual meeting, we approved the budget, essentially saying, "Put me in, coach, I'm ready to play."

We heard Pastor Ken talk about "sticker shock for the soul," when Jesus instructed a follower who asked what he needed to do to inherit eternal life to sell everything he had and give the money to the poor. Not just a tithe – *everything*. The follower thought he had been doing everything right: he was keeping the commandments and he was likely making a regular sacrifice to Yahweh. Yet Jesus challenged him, and challenges us, to let go of those possessions that we rely on for everyday needs and wants, and to be "all in" with Him.

Finally, I told you about visiting my mother in Maine this fall. One day, she and I joined a church group that was ministering to a nursing home. One of the songs that the group shared was a "remix" (if you will) of the "Hokey Pokey," called, for lack of a catchier name, the "Holy Yokey" and based on the Greatest Commandment: "you shall love the Lord God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind." As the leader introduced the song, she talked about how we often think *we* are in charge of our lives and have it all together. But then God "shakes it all about" and "turns us all around." Yes, I'm afraid you will never think of that song the same!

You put your whole heart in (soul, mind) You take your whole heart out (soul, mind) You put your whole heart in (soul, mind) And God shakes it all about! You do the Holy Yokey and God turns us all around, That's what it's all about!

Are you feeling "all shook up" with Pastor Ken, Tim, and me talking about the budget? These talks were meant to catch your attention. Let's renew our commitment to God's calling with our whole heart, soul, and mind. We've learned the Gospel. We love the Gospel. Let's live the Gospel. All. In.



# **From Bishop Satterlee**

In Christ, we learn that God is in control but not as a ruthless tyrant ruling by force and intimidation. God loves us so much that God gave up all control and allowed us to nail Jesus to the cross. But God raised Jesus from the dead. And we learned that, though God's kingdom is resistible, God's kingdom is invincible. God raised Jesus from the dead. And we learned that, though we can do things to diminish ourselves, we cannot dethrone God. God raised Jesus from the dead. And we learned that, though we can do things to diminish ourselves, we cannot dethrone God. God raised Jesus from the dead. And we learned that, though God lets us do it our way—greed, status, ruthlessness, intimidation, power, violence, and hate—in the end it will be God's way. And what is God's way? God's way is to never give up on any of us, even when what we do breaks God's heart. God's way is to have a purpose for each and every one of us and for our life together. For the one thing God cannot bear is to give us up.

Our children need to know that God will never give them up. Whether they're four or five or forty-five, our kids need to know that God will never give them up. So, part of our mission is not to give up on our kids—no matter how old they are. In practical terms, not giving up on our kids means calling and inviting and bringing them to church. But more important, not giving up on our kids means taking a risk and sharing with them how and why our faith is important to our real life and asking nothing in return. Most important, not giving up on our kids means listening to them and being willing to change, even to change the church. Worship needs to be an experience of God's kingdom of justice, truth, goodness, love, and peace. And that means that the Christian community is different from the world.

In the Christian community, we admit our faults and failings, and the response is forgiveness and acceptance rather than ridicule and revenge. In the Christian community, we tell the stories of how God never gave up on Abraham and Sarah, Moses and Miriam, Mary Magdalene and Peter, you and me. In the Christian community, we pray for those whom the world would just assume give up, and our prayer leads us not to give up on them. In the Christian community, we offer ourselves, not to get something back, but in gratitude for all that we have. In the Christian community, we come to a table where everyone is equal, where all who have been baptized into God's family have a place; a table where we take the King into ourselves and know that he is ours and we are his.

Our children need this experience. They need to be the Church, not tomorrow but today. They need to give and to receive forgiveness, to hear and to tell the Story, to pray for others and to be prayed for, to have the gifts they offer received and used. Our children need to be welcome at the King's table, to receive Christ's presence into the very marrow of their bones, and to know that this is the one place in all the world where they are valued just as they are, where they are valued no matter what they do, where they are valued so much that neither Christ nor his Church will ever give up on them.

Sometime in the next few years or the next few minutes or the next few seconds, our children are going to be out in the world and come face to face with Pilate. And he is going to ask them, "Who is your king?" And if they know the Jesus who never gives up on them, our children will belong to the truth, and hear his voice, and have his strength to stare Pilate down and to recognize the greed, status, ruthlessness, intimidation, power, violence, and hate that he offers for the deceit, devastation, and death that they are. For our children will have something better: our children will have the best. Having Jesus, our children have life. No matter how old they are or how you defined them, talk to your children about Jesus and how much he loves them.


