

ANNOUNCEMENTS

To impress on the minds and hearts of believers the awful consequence of sin and the magnitude of the Savior's sacrifice, the ancient church held a special service called *Tenebrae* in the last days in Holy Week.

The meaning of the word *Tenebrae* is darkness. The service began in silence and ended in almost total darkness, the lights being gradually extinguished as the service proceeded.

The **Extinguishing of the Candles** is to remind us of the events that led to the darkness which covered the earth on the first Good Friday. According to some authorities, it could signify the flight of the disciples.

In our service, one candle remains **burning** to symbolize the fact that Christ did not remain in the grave but rose again. The forces of hell could not prevail against the Light of the World.

Because of the dramatic nature of this service and the mood that it creates, no offering will be taken during the service. Offering plates will be located at the exits should you desire to make an offering as you leave.

This is the most solemn of worship services: Quiet and meditation should be maintained throughout.

All those who are worshipping with us are requested, at the end of this service, to leave quietly in order to preserve the spirit of the worship.

A Word of Pardon Luke 23:27-34

²⁷A great number of the people followed him, and among them were women who were beating their breasts and wailing for him. ²⁸But Jesus turned to them and said, "Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me, but weep for yourselves and for your children. ²⁹For the days are surely coming when they will say, 'Blessed are the barren, and the wombs that never bore, and the breasts that never nursed.' ³⁹Then they will begin to say to the mountains, 'Fall on us'; and to the hills, 'Cover us.' ³⁹For if they do this when the wood is green, what will happen when it is dry?"

³²Two others also, who were criminals, were led away to be put to death with him. ³³When they came to the place that is called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. ³⁴Then Jesus said, "Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing."
