





- Servers—you can find out when you are scheduled to serve in worship for the month either on the website, in the bulletin announcements or on the sheet in your mailbox.

This month's discussion on Grace's strategic plan looks at how we, currently and into the future, "develop relationships and acceptance in the community." To clear one thing up right away, Grace already is accepted in the community, so this is not focusing on how to get people to "like" us (though many have "liked" our Facebook page!). Rather, these efforts seek to increase acceptance of one another and bring the community together.

We do A LOT of things that show God's love for all the world. Just to name a few, we give to Family Promise, Barry County Cares, and our food box; we send our youth to Synod and ELCA Youth Gatherings where they conduct community projects while building their faith; we organize the Good Friday Cross Walk; we have led jail worship. We could probably fill up this GraceGram with ways we reach out to our neighbors, to the suffering, and to the marginalized. At the very least, you can see each Grace committee's activities in the council minutes and the annual report.

The community knows Grace's name through the works we do: we have a two-mile stretch of M-43 that we clean up several times a year for the Adopt-A-Highway program, we continue to have biannual (sometimes tri-annual!) pasty sales, our annual geranium sale has morphed into offering additional flowering plants, and we've had several car shows that include an outdoor worship service (weather permitting) and a barbeque lunch. Some of these activities are long-standing traditions whereas others are newer, yet quickly becoming, traditions.

Not only does Grace become known to the community in the more obvious ways just listed, but some interfaith relationship-building occurs more quietly. Pastor Ken meets with the Hastings Area Ministerial Association (HAMA) monthly, and those ecumenical meetings have resulted in Lenten lunch-and-learn services and the community Thanksgiving service. Some of our members spend their Saturday mornings helping to serve breakfast at Emmanuel Episcopal, developing relationships not only with the other churches participating in this outreach but getting to know the guests who come in to get a good meal and good conversation.

Many times, these activities started with someone bringing forth their idea: they saw a need and said, "Why don't we do X?" Is an idea for a new Grace event percolating inside your head? Don't be shy, bring it to church leadership so that we can help it bear fruit!

THE GIVING TREE



We are providing an opportunity for our members to donate socks, shoes, underwear, hats and gloves that will be distributed to area elementary school children. The tree is set up near the coatroom in the gathering area. Gift tags listing clothing sizes, etc. are hanging from the tree branches. Donations may be left, unwrapped, under the tree.

Celebrate the Season with Grace

The Promise: The advent wreath, a circle, came to represent the eternal victory over death through Jesus Christ. The evergreens were a sign of the faithfulness of God to God's people, even in death, and the lighted candles were a reminder of the light of Christ brought into the world. The candles for the Sundays of Advent are blue and represent Hope, Peace and Joy and Love. The center white candle is for the birth of the Christ Child.



PASTY SALE UPDATE


Many THANKS to all that helped, bought, or prayed over Pasty Sales. You are all "Saints of the Pasties" to Vickey and me. We sold 400 pasties this fall and should clear around \$1900.00 to help replenish the Grace Contingency Fund.

Like when I started to question and doubt if we'd even sell 300...but alas the sales sheet filled up nicely. Then when I was cautious in purchasing supplies and we needed 8 more pounds of lard the day before flour prep...but none to be found at Family Fare. Sure enough...the Good Lord placed exactly 8 pounds left on the shelf at Walmart. Then I realized late that I had not picked up the diced onions. We needed 20 pounds. I stopped at Gordon Food Service like always and looked and looked and looked. Finally I asked a worker who directed me to where they would be ... if they had them cause he couldn't see any from where we were standing.

Was I to find exactly 20 pounds on the shelf??? Yes! Wow...coincidence or God taking care of the ol' man??? You decide. Then we began cutting the meat and found we had only 1 pound extra. On Saturday, we had a couple new faces show up...what a blessing and blessed miracle as they stepped in to do "whatever" was needed and it got us and kept us rolling nicely.

Long story short...believe in God and he'll provide. Oh...and by the way. We made exactly enough for 400 pasties...yet we show 407 sold with nobody complaining about missing out. Go figure that one? Kinda like blessing the bread and fish ... right?




