The Word Takes a Walk

Today's gospel reading does not celebrate some bucolic scene of two young parents cradling their newborn. This day is not *simply* the remembrance of a time gone by when the baby Jesus was born into the world on a cold night in a stable meant for animals. Today — the first Sunday of Christmas — trains us to see the event of the incarnation not as something that happened long ago, but as an event that is always happening here in the world today. Today we go back to square one: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God ... And the Word became flesh and lived among us" (John 1:1, 14). Christmas is the celebration of the incarnation. It is the celebration of a God who does more than just talk a big game but who puts God's body on the line, who manifests God's intentions and desires and love.

Today is marked by celebration and by call. The celebration is that God is presently at work, embodying love and presence in our lives. God is not an abstraction, but rather our tangible reality. The call is for us to be a part of that incarnation. What Christmas tells us is that God makes good use of bodies; God even inhabited one! The call of Christmas is to answer the question: How does God's love long to inhabit and make good use of *your* body? How does God desire to reveal God's promises through *you*?

Today we gather to celebrate the miracle of Christmas, the fact that God walks off the page in the form of Jesus Christ and into the world in which we live. Keep your eyes open and look: Where is God's Word, which creates and redeems the whole world, taking on flesh in your church, in your home, in your community, and in the world? Wherever that happens, Christmas has come.
