I have been blessed to be your pastor for almost 6 years. Grace Lutheran Church has been a place where the GRACE of God has been lived out. Of course God's grace has not always been lived out every single moment. As pastor, I have witnessed some harsh words and actions played out. But none compare to a time I was at Zion, Canton, Ohio.

A member stood up and made a motion at the annual meeting to remove gay members from the staff. At the time there were three such members of the staff. Ken (yes, that was his name) did not get anyone to second his motion. Damage was done.

Ken left the church. I had a chance to talk with him. I shared with Ken Romans chapter eight. Our discussion centered around how Jesus reconciled all of us even those whose sin seemed unforgivable. After about an hour of discussion, I asked him, "Do you believe that gay people are not reconciled to God through Jesus Christ?" He answered, "Of course God has accepted them and loves them. But it is too late. I can never go back to Zion." I told him he was welcome anytime. Ken did eventually come back. He continued to bake cookies and give them to the children. Ken was known as the cookie guy. It was a hard and difficult time for the congregation, but RECONCILATION was far more important than pride or hurt feelings.



Some of you might be questioning, "Why are you telling such a story?" Because something like that has happened here at Grace. When I authorized an ad that welcomed the queer community, some members in the congregation reacted in a negative manner. I remind us all that we are all sinners, and yet by the grace of God, we are forgiven, loved and welcomed. No sin is able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord. Let us be welcoming and inviting as the Lutherans up at the Escanaba State Fair, who welcomed the Wales along with all sorts of people. Lutherans have welcomed slaves to live as equals, women to be pastors, youth to be leaders, the disabled to work in the church and the queer community to live as members who receive God's grace, forgiveness, mercy and complete acceptance. Let us live reconciled one unto another through the power of our awesome God.



# **Email Scams from Bishop Satterlee**

We received this message from the Bishop's office. Always remember, if you get emails from anywhere asking you for money, or for your personal information, make sure you verify that it is a legitimate request. If you ever receive a questionable email from Grace, please call the office right away.

"We've received reports of people fraudulent emails from Bishop Satterlee asking them to contact him "discreetly." Ultimately, these emails ask people to send money or gift cards. **These emails are not from Bishop Satterlee**. Bishop Satterlee and the Synod Staff will not contact you in this way. Please **do not** respond to these emails or send any money or gift cards.

This type of email scam is prevalent in church communities. In this scam, people pretending to be someone you know send an email asking for help and for you to send them gift cards or wire them money. If you receive one of these emails, **do not** respond to the email or send any personal information, money, or gift cards.

We have additional resources on email spoofing, email scams, and internet security on our website. We invite you to learn more about email scams and how to best protect yourself and your information online."
