Because God transcends human understanding and expression, I have been blessed to witness an expansive language for God. Expansive language includes language and imagery that is not limited to the human. The Scriptures are full of such imagery, e.g., God as rock, fortress, and shield (Psalm 18:2), God as bird (Isaiah 31:5), God as fountain of living water (Jeremiah 2:13, 17:13). Expanding the language we use for God honors the magnitude of who God is and challenges and broadens our understandings and experience of God.

The parking lot has been lined and new directional arrows have been added.



This is a great event to gather with our community to honor and remember loved ones and take action for lifesaving change in the fight against cancer. Your donations help the ACS continue to...

- 1. Fund vital cancer research. Did you know that as the largest private nonprofit funder of cancer research, ACS has invested more than \$5 billion since 1946? ACS works to be there for scientists to support them as they keep great research going to take their ideas from dream to reality.
- 2. Provide support and trusted information through their 24-hour helpline at 1.800.227.2345 or via video chat at cancer.org. Nearly 1.4 millions calls were answered last year.
