



### Never Been to a Relay for Life Event??? Here are the FOUR Relay For Life Signature Elements



#### 1. Survivor

Celebration of Survivors~ We set aside time in our Relay to celebrate our local cancer survivors. We encourage you to invite friends and family currently living with cancer or survivors to attend and join in the celebration approximately 5pm on Saturday....Followed by a survivors' dinner.

All attendees of the event are asked to line the track during the survivor lap and cheer on our survivors. Pro tip: Bring noise makers, pom-poms, anything you bring to a pep rally to cheer those survivors on!

#### 2. Caregiver

Celebration of Caregivers~ After the Survivor Lap, caregivers are invited to join the survivors. A caregiver is a friend or family member that helped a person with cancer, regardless of if they are still with us. It may even be a healthcare worker.

Attendees are again asked to line the track and cheer for our caregivers!

#### 3. Luminaria

Meaningful Luminaria~ We will take time to remember those we have lost to cancer and reflect on the journey of those who have survived.

At the Barry County Relay For Life, teams help light luminaria bags that are dedicated in honor, or in memory, of a loved one. This happens at dusk and is followed by several laps in meaningful silence. Luminaria are available at Grace Lutheran throughout the month of August.

#### 4. Fight Back
